"The First Missionary Journey" – Acts 13:4-Acts 14:28

This was the first attempt of the Early Church to go "into the uttermost parts of the world." It was a journey that would take Barnabas and Saul, who would soon be known as Paul, into the heart of the region of Galatia. Although there were Jewish communities here, the people remained primarily pagan in their worship. In these two chapters of Acts we get a perspective of the message that was shared and the results of that proclamation. We shall close by asking ourselves, what truly makes a church successful?

“Galatians – Legalism vs. Grace” – Galatians 1-6

This letter, written by the Apostle Paul, is considered to be one of his earliest. It was written to those churches that he and Barnabas had established during their first missionary journey. The reports that Paul was receiving were not very encouraging to him. In fact, he discovered that they had turned away from the Gospel that brought freedom to another gospel that brought enslavement. Throughout this letter, Paul helps the readers to understand the relationship between faith and law and what it means to be free in Christ.

SEPTEMBER 22

Thru the Bible: The Thread of Redemption Proclaimed

“An Important Decision” – Acts 15:1-35

As a consequence of that first missionary journey a difficult question now confronts that Early Church. What should be done with these Gentiles who are coming to faith in Christ Jesus? You have to remember that this is primarily a Jewish Church. They all had a similar foundation. But what about these formerly pagans who were becoming part of the Church? Should they be required to be circumcised? Should they be required to keep all the rules? The debate that occurred in this chapter, of which we are only given the highlights, is an important one with some keys for us on how to solve problems that arise. Because of these principles, the Early Church was spared a division that would have hampered its growth.

SEPTEMBER 29—FAITH@HOME SUNDAY

“What Is Your Most Important Legacy?” – Psalm 78:1-8

Have you ever thought of how you want to be remembered when you are gone? When someone mentions your name, what is the one thing that you most want them to remember about you? What will be your legacy? The psalmist Asaph wrestled with this thought as he wrote this, the second longest of the Psalms. And what was the foundation of Asaph’s legacy? It was the stories recorded in the Scriptures. He reminds his readers that telling those stories will lead people to God. It will help them to experience a change in their thinking about the events of life. And it will help his readers to follow God with an obedient will. We all are creating a legacy that will outlive each one of us. What will your legacy be?

CHILL OUT (GRADES 9-12)

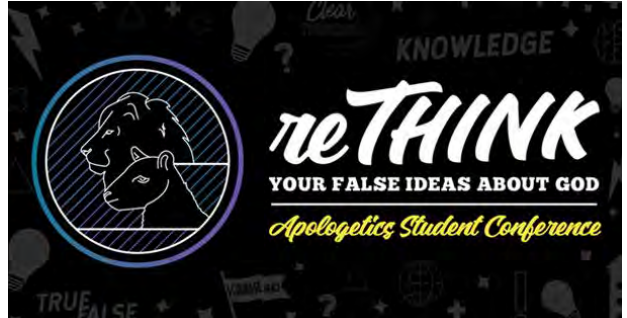
