UPCOMING MESSAGES

AUGUST 22 // A Shepherd Looks at Worship – A Study of Psalm 23

There are more musical compositions set to this text than any other in all literature. It's the favorite for funerals and one of the most requested of hospital chaplains. Yet, this psalm is seldom seen as a psalm of worship. It is the celebration of a Shepherd, a psalm of praise. The Shepherd is our provider, our contentment, and our guide. He is with us in difficult times, and He has a purpose and a future for each one of us.

AUGUST 29 // What If I Don't Feel Like Worshiping – A Study of Psalms 13 & 37

We may attend church on a Sunday morning with our hearts not inclined to worship. Perhaps we are frustrated or angry with God, or filled with questions while He seems silent. Should we abandon coming together when we feel this? Both of these psalms indicate that the times we feel the least like worshiping are the times we need to pour out our hearts before Him, letting worship show us God's love and care.

SEPTEMBER 5 // Worship: A Celebration of Praise-A Study of Psalm 103

In this Psalm, David's heart cries out in thanksgiving to God for all He has provided. We are reminded of those things we often take for granted and should praise the Lord for redemption, forgiveness and spiritual healing. This Psalm begins with a call to "praise the Lord" and ends with a similar refrain. Our hearts should always be filled with thanksgiving to God.

New sermon series on BCC's Statement of Faith

SEPTEMBER 12 // So, What Do YOU Believe about...the Bible?" (Statement #1)

10:00 am Outdoor Service

The Word of God is inspired. The Word of God is inerrant. The Word of God is the complete revelation of God. The Word of God is the final authority.

SEPTEMBER 19 // So, What Do YOU Believe about...God?" (Statement #2)

God is one God. God is Spirit. God is eternal. God is omnipotent. God is omniscient. God is omnipresent. God is love. God is holy. God is the Creator of all. God is Triune.

SEPTEMBER 26 // So, What Do YOU Believe about...Jesus Christ?" (Statement #3)

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."

Just who is Jesus? Why did He come? What happened while He was here? How can He change my life?

OCTOBER 3 // So, What Do YOU Believe about...the Holy Spirit?" (Statement #4)

The ministry of the Holy Spirit is to glorify Christ. The ministry of the Holy Spirit is to convict the world of sin. The ministry of the Holy Spirit is to help us with the indwelling of the Spirit, the guiding of the Spirit, and the empowering of the Spirit.

OCTOBER 10 // Creation Sunday– Bryan Osborne from Answers in Genesis

Bryan Osborne holds a master's degree in the Art of Teaching from Lee University. He taught Bible history in the public school for 13 years, and has been teaching Christians to defend their faith for nearly 20 years. Bryan is a speaker and author for Answers in Genesis and will deliver the morning message, "The Genesis of the Gospel."

OCTOBER 17 // So, What Do YOU Believe about...Man & Sin?" (Statement #5)

Man is a created being. Man is a fallen being. Man is a helpless being. Man is NOT a hopeless being.

OCTOBER 24 // So, What Do YOU Believe about...Salvation?" (Statement #6)

The blood of Jesus Christ is the price of redemption. The resurrection of Jesus Christ is the proof of our redemption. The acceptance of Jesus Christ is the only way to experience redemption. The rewards of salvation include being declared justified and being adopted into the family of God.

OCTOBER 31 // So, What Do YOU Believe about...the Church?" (Statements #7&8)

The Church is made up of those who have been regenerated. The Church is united in Christ Jesus. The Church and its relationship to Jesus Christ is described as being like that of a husband and wife and the head and the body.

NOVEMBER 7 // So, What Do YOU Believe about...the Future?" (Statement #9)

Is this all there is? Is this all that life offers? Is there something else? Is anyone in control? What is God really doing? As one looks at this world, it is so important that, as believers, we recognize that God is in total control and that there is hope for us.

NOVEMBER 14 // So, What Do YOU Believe about...Heaven & Hell?" (Statement #10)

Is life over when a person dies, or is there something beyond death? The Bible tells us that two eternal destinations await an individual following death: heaven, the glorious abode for those who have trusted in Christ, and hell, the terrible abode for those who have rejected Christ.

NOVEMBER 21 // So, What Does the Bible teach about Human Sexuality?

This is one of the most important, yet controversial issues facing the Church in these days. Does the Bible speak to this issue? What does God say? Is there an answer to this question that can be foundational for us?

The world seems to have become a confused and chaotic place. Yet, for the follower of Jesus Christ, the command to be salt and light in this world has not changed. How can followers become successful in the midst of the assault? The answer is simple, and yet profound: "...I felt I had to write and urge you to contend for the faith that was once for all entrusted to the saints." (Jude 3). Jude declares that we are in a battle—a counter-revolution, if you will. Join us to learn how to see the world from a biblical viewpoint.

Joel's Prophecy on the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, thus, has a short-range fulfillment (the Spirit's infilling of Jesus' Followers on the Day of Pentecost) and a long-range fulfillment (the Spirit's infilling of the Jewish Remnant during the Day of the LORD). Damtew Kifelew • The Jesus Film/CRU

We are working with 20 strategic countries in Africa in order to accelerate church multiplication. To equip and mobilize in these countries, a collaborative alliance was formed between us and 12 other mission agencies working in Africa to pool resources. We have also identified 37 more languages to focus on in translating the Jesus Film into local languages. A Jesus Film equipment distribution hub for the Africa region was established in Nairobi, Kenya. This will reduce shipping costs for backpacks, church planting tools and equipment. 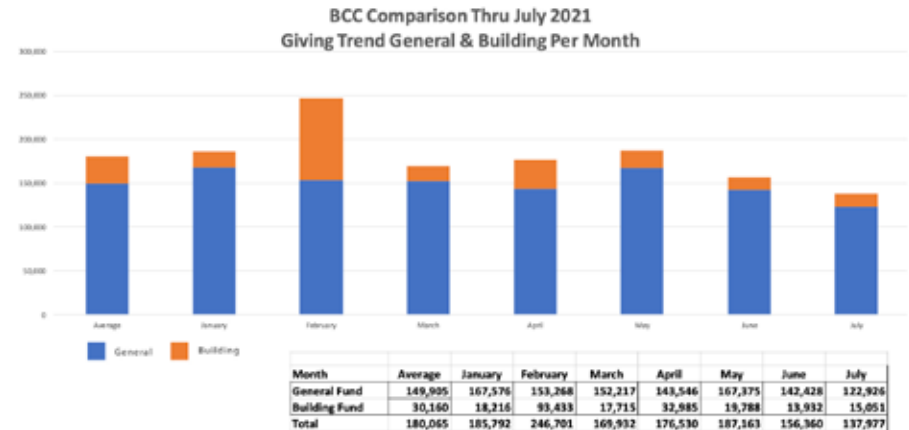
