REMEMBER, REMEMBER, REMEMBER...

2 Timothy: Chapter 2 (1-26)

"Inside Out" is a Disney/Pixar moving about a young girl who has the traumatic experience of moving from Minnesota to California. One of the main ideas of the movie, that is based on research into the human brain, is that people have *core memories*. These core memories influence who a person is and the future decisions that they make.

These core memories, in many ways, shape their future.

This morning we're going to see that Paul encouraged Timothy for a future faith fight without him by calling him to:

REMEMBER THE CORE OF CHRISTIANITY, REMEMBER JESUS CHRIST, AND REMEMBER GOD'S WORD.

REMEMBER THE CORE OF CHRISTIANITY (vv. 1-7)

Be Strong – in Grace

Christianity cannot be reinvented, it is "handed-down."

"...having always taught the things which he had learned from the apostles, and which the Church has handed down, and which alone are true." -Irenaeus

The early Church refuted false teachers by essentially saying, "Can you trace that interpretation back to what the Apostles taught us, or did you make it up?"

REMEMBER JESUS CHRIST (vv. 8-13)

Jesus Christ, the Resurrected Jewish King isn't the Whole Gospel The Cross is central to Paul's preaching of the Gospel.

The Lordship and Resurrection of Jesus is the reason that Christians were persecuted A higher authority than Caesar is a political, moral flash point.

The Gospel isn't chained – but flourishes where the Church is persecuted. (Examples: China and Iran today.)

REMEMBER GOD'S WORD (vv.14-26)

Contend, without being Contentious

False teachers "creep" in
