EASTER DISCOVERIES

Pastor Mark Stromberg

MARK 16:1-8

“It is terrible to wake up on Easter morning and have no voice with which to shout, ‘He is risen!’ But it would still be more terrible to have a voice and not want to shout.” –W.E. Sangster

WHAT WE DISCOVER IS FAR MORE PROFOUND THAT WHAT WE IMAGINE OR DREAM UP.

WHAT DID THOSE FIRST WITNESSES TO THE RESURRECTION DISCOVER?

They found a vanished stone. (Mark 16:2-4)

‘Roll away, roll away, roll away. All the burdens of my heart roll away.’

They found a vacant sepulcher. (Mark 16:5-6)

For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas (Peter), and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born. –1 Corinthians 15:3-8

Resurrection-faith built upon resurrection-fact!

They found a victorious Savior. (Mark 16:7)
