THE GRACE OF BARNABAS IS EXPRESSED THROUGH HIS GENEROSITY Acts 4:32-37 – The believers share their possessions

Joseph, a Levite from Cyprus, whom the apostles called Barnabas (which means "son of encouragement"), sold a field he owned and brought the money and put it at the apostles' feet.

E GRACE OF BARNABAS IS EXPRESSED THROUGH HIS ACCEPTANCE

Acts 9:19-28 – Saul in Damascus and Jerusalem

When he (Paul) came to Jerusalem, he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he really was a disciple. But Barnabas took him and brought him to the apostles.

THE GRACE OF BARNABAS IS EXPRESSED THROUGH HIS OPEN-MINDEDNESS

Acts 11:19-26-The Church in Antioch

Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen (who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch) and Saul. While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." So after they had fasted and prayed, they placed their hands on them and sent them off.

From Paphos, Paul <u>and his companions</u> sailed to Perga in Pamphylia, where John left them to return to Jerusalem.

THE GRACE OF BARNABAS IS EXPRESSED THROUGH HIS FORGIVENESS

Acts 15:35-41 - Disagreement between Paul and Barnabas

Sometime later Paul said to Barnabas, "Let us go back and visit the believers in all the towns where we preached the word of the Lord and see how they are doing." Barnabas wanted to take John, also called Mark, with them, but Paul did not think it wise to take him, because he had deserted them in Pamphylia and had not continued with them in the work. They had such a sharp disagreement that they parted company. Barnabas took Mark and sailed for Cyprus, but Paul chose Silas and left, commended by the believers to the grace of the Lord.
